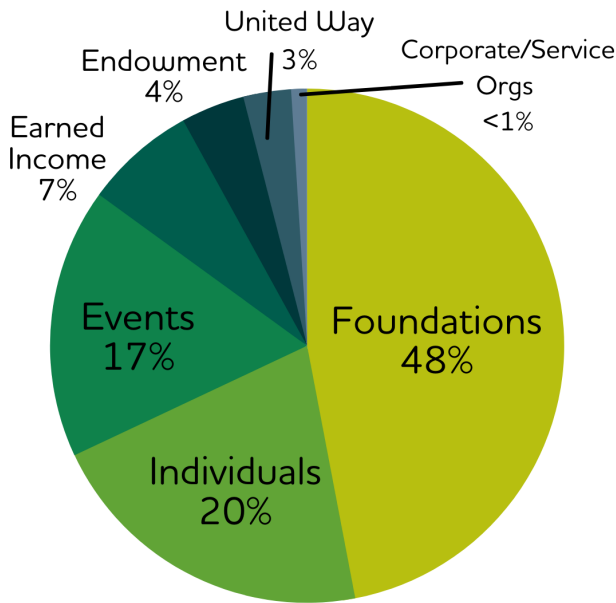

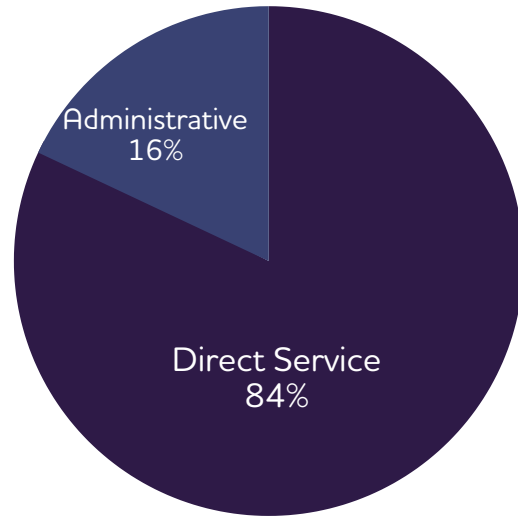
2020-2021 Income
